## Checklist for Referees of SSPCM'05 papers

When refereeing a manuscript, please pay attention to the following items:

- 1. The paper should contain sufficient novel information within SSPCM standards: avoiding redundance with respect to previous papers.
- 2. The manuscript should be easily readable concerning language, style and presentation. If a paper is recommended for publication, proposal of linguistic correction of the manuscript are useful.
- 3. The Title of a paper should be comprehensive, but not too long.
- 4. The Abstract should correspond to the contents of the paper. It should comprise the problem, the method, and the essential results.
- 5. The Introduction should contain the present state of knowledge and the aims of the work.
- 6. References should reflect the present state of knowledge, be sufficiently topical and given in adequate quantity (most recent relevant references, not too many self-citations or not-easily accessible sources).
- 7. Formulas should correspond to the subject dealt with both in number and quality (no textbook level) and contain only symbols which are explained. The limits of validity of derivations and results should be given.
- 8. Figures should be presented in adequate number and be clearly arranged. Halftone figures and photographs should be conclusive and show sufficient contrast.
- 9. Conclusions, if any, should point to the progress achieved, not repeat the abstract.
- 10. A reasonable relation between scientific content of a paper and its length should be paid attention to.
